## Safety Officer's Report By P/C Jerry Wise, SN

# With all the sophisticated electronic sensors available, how can this happen???

I'm at the fuel dock in Charleston waiting to gas my Grady White 28 sailfish for a day's fun offshore. Just ahead a boat owner is fueling his boat while the dock attendant is talking to a friend. A faint smell of gasoline was growing. At that moment the dock attendant and I noticed the boat owner was fueling the rod holder on the stern of his inboard powered boat. The dock attendant killed the gas pump power and I dove for the bow line on my boat to get out of there. It must have been ok because I didn't hear an explosion heading out into the harbor. (Rod holders generally are open to the bilge and he was fueling up the bottom of his boat instead of the gas tank.)

Gasoline explosions on enclosed boats can be devastating. There have even been explosions where the vent fans haven't been run long enough, leaving just enough explosive mixture to ignite. A recent internet news site did an article that shows the power in a boat explosion. It blew the boat in half at the hull joint. I've had a number of enclosed boats over the years from 18 to 35 feet and always been scared of the vent process for gas fumes. There are a number of fuel/gas/flammable gas detectors available on every marine retail site. The one thing I've always made sure of is to have more than one detector and have one wired directly to the battery. This detector is always on and you don't have to turn on the ignition key to activate gas detection. If you get on the boat and that one is going off its a good time to investigate or run away. Just a little extra security at minimal cost.

Even a new or well maintained boat can have leaks develop or hoses begin to deteriorate. Periodic inspection will help keep you safe. Here are a few pointers.

#### Safety Measures to Reduce the Risk of Explosion

- Regular Maintenance: Check fuel lines, tanks, and fittings regularly for leaks or wear and replace any damaged components.
- Ventilation: Ensure proper ventilation of the engine room and fuel storage areas to prevent vapor buildup. Install bilge blowers that can expel harmful fumes.
- Fueling Safely: Always turn off the engine before fueling. Avoid overfilling and check for spills.
- Keep the area well-ventilated during refueling.
- Avoid Ignition Sources: Keep electrical systems, batteries, and engines in good working order.
- Install explosion-proof equipment where possible, and never use open flames near fuel sources.
- Carbon Monoxide and Gas Detectors: Install appropriate detectors for both flammable gases and carbon monoxide to alert you to unsafe conditions.

By adhering to safety protocols and maintaining the boat and its systems, the risk of a gasoline explosion can be minimized, ensuring the safety of everyone on board.

# **Educational Report**By Lt/C Brian Warman



To emphasize the importance of Power Squadron and USCG education programs on safe boat handling instruction, here are some sobering statistics from the US Coast Guard: Where boater safety education was known in boating deaths, 77.1% of deaths had no education and less than 1% of deaths are attributed to those who had US Power Squadron or USCG education. <sup>1</sup>

#### **Lake Norman Facts**

- <u>Created in 1963 by Duke Energy</u>, the area is separated by four different counties, Iredell County, Catawba County, Mecklenburg County and Lincoln County.
- It is 33.6 miles (54.1 km) long, 9 miles (14 km) wide, and has 520 miles (840 km) of shoreline. Its average depth is 33.5 feet (10.2 m), but at its outlet it reaches a depth of 110 feet (34 m).
